Kaua'i's Role in the Hawa'i Clean Energy Initiative

Lihu'e, Kaua'i, HI – The public is invited to attend a free community forum that will outline the state's new framework for energy solutions for the islands. The evening forum, "Hawai'i Clean Energy Initiative and What it Means for Kaua'i," is set for Tuesday, February 10 at the Līhu'e Missionary Church auditorium from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. Doors open at 6:00 pm.

The Hawai'i Clean Energy Initiative (HCEI) was announced by Governor Lingle late last year. The initiative addresses the strategic changes that are needed in Hawai'i's energy policies, regulatory structure, energy delivery systems and use of renewable energy sources.

The forum will discuss this transformative process and Kaua'i's potential to implement more sustainable practices within the industry.

The presenters include Bill Parks, Deputy Assistant Secretary for Electricity & Energy Reliability, U.S. Department of Energy; Ted Peck, Energy Administrator, Hawai'i State Energy Office; Robert Alm, Executive Vice President, Hawaiian Electric Company (HECO); and Randall Hee, President & CEO, Kaua'i Island Utility Cooperative (KIUC).

Līhu'e Missionary Church is located at 4383 Rice Street, across from the Historic County Building.
