# Imagining Lihue's Future - Town Hall Meetings November 12 and 14

Lihue is often called the "heart of Kauai" and serves as the government and commercial center of the island. The County will soon begin work to update the Lihue Development Plan. What should Lihue look like in 30 years? Can we ensure that it is well planned and meets the needs of its residents?

Join your Lihue friends and neighbors in November as they share their thoughts on these questions with the American Institute of Architect's **Sustainable Design Assessment**Team to help create recommendations for how we plan for our future. The emphasis will be on five areas of importance to the Lihue District: 1)

Land use (including agriculture, smart growth, housing and affordability), 2) Energy efficiency and alternative energy, 3) Water and wastewater, 4) Transportation and transit and 5) Economic development (including education, employment, workforce, retirees and solid waste).
