### **KPAA Priorities 2014-2016**

At the December 4 membership meeting, community priorities were adopted for KPAA to focus on for the next three years. We look forward to working with the community on these important issues.



- 1. Support the development of Kauai's youth from keiki to career so they are ready to learn and ready for life.
- 2. Improve and maintain County and State parks.
- 3. Report on community trends by publishing a biennial Community Indicators Report.
- 4. Assess Kauai's sustainability and promote action for resilience and self-sufficiency.
  - Strengthen our agriculture sector to ensure Kauai's food security.
  - Protect the availability, quality and quantity of ground and surface water.
  - Identify and advocate for strategies and tools to manage growth to align with the General Plan and other plans that impact Kauai.
  - Support efforts to reduce solid waste through the 3 R's of Reduce, Reuse and Recycle.

## **New Community Indicators Report Coming in 2014**



We will be publishing the fourth biennial report for the island's businesses, nonprofits and government decision-makers. We track approximately 50 indicators spanning economic and business climate; public education; neighborhood and community health; civic engagement; natural environment; land use and rural character; and cultures and arts.

Opportunities for action are also suggested.

### **Building the Bridge from Education to Career**

In November, Keiki to Career Kauai partnered with the Kauai Chamber of Commerce Small Business Education Committee and Kapaa High School to bring together more than 40 students, parents, and business, education and community leaders from around the island to discuss career readiness. The gathering helped identify existing efforts in high schools



and Kauai Community College to prepare young adults for the workforce, and how those efforts can be further enhanced by partnerships with local businesses and community programs.

## Kalalau Trail Rehabilitation Nears Completion



The folks who were instrumental in the Kalalau Trail
Rehabilitation Project celebrated its "Topping Off" earlier this
month. After walking the entire project corridor on
December 9, Curt Cottrell, DLNR's Division of State Parks
Assistant Administrator, declared to the gathering, "The trail
is now in the best condition it has been in for thirty years!"

This two year, million-dollar project to rehabilitate the eight miles of spectacular hiking trail from Hanakapi'ai Stream to Kalalau Stream is now in its final stage. As of mid-December 2013, there is a single week-long deployment of Pono Pacific's trail building crew to Napali remaining on their schedule. This project included the innovative application of erosion control matting and out-planting of appropriate native plants in an experiment intended to minimize the displacement of soils above the trail—a major cause of deteriorating trail conditions. Let us know how you like the safer, improved trail!
