## Local Documentary "Hawai`i's Climate Crisis" Airs on KHON 2

This eye-opening one-hour documentary is scheduled to air at 9 p.m., January 15 on KHON 2. In the same way that former Vice President Al Gore first exposed the science behind climate change to many Americans, "Hawai`i's Climate Crisis" illustrates how global warming presents unique challenges for Hawai`i and will require unique actions if we are to lessen its impact.

Local video producer Ted Obringer (OC16's Go Green Hawai`i series) and veteran broadcast journalist Russell Shimooka speak with government officials, legislators, policy makers, environmental advocates, scientists and business leaders to examine what climate change may mean for Hawai`i's environment and economy.
