Smart Growth Workshop Held

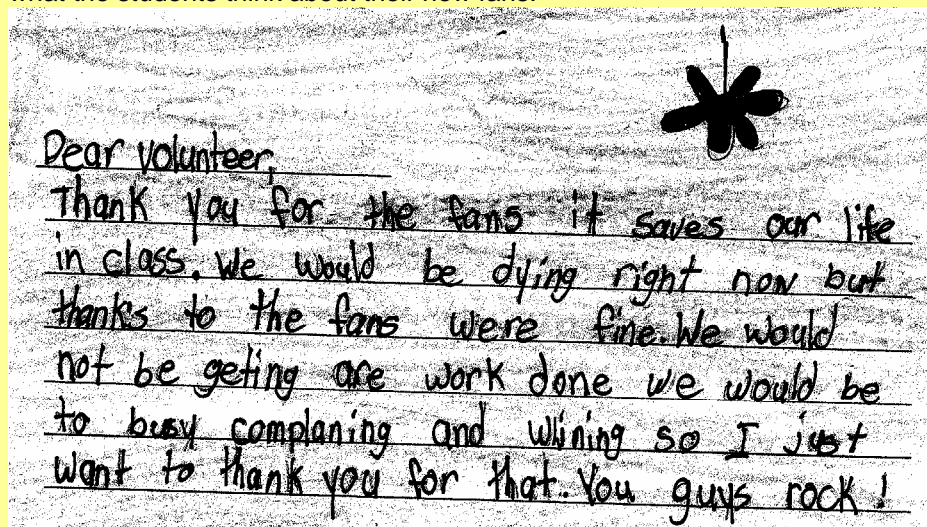
The Kauaʻi Board of Realtors hosted a well-attended public workshop on Smart Growth on June 4th with speaker Bob McNamara from the National Board of Realtors. Many communities are utilizing or adapting smart growth principles to create more attractive and better-designed communities to enhance quality of life and preserve open spaces. The principles of smart growth include:

- ♦ Create a Range of Housing Opportunities and Choices
- ♦ Create Walkable Neighborhoods
- ♦ Foster Distinctive, Attractive Communities with a Strong Sense of Place
- ♦ Make Development Decisions Predictable, Fair and Cost Effective
- ♦ Mix Land Uses
- ♦ Preserve Open Space, Farmland, Natural Beauty and Critical Environmental Areas
- ♦ Provide a Variety of Transportation Choices
- ♦ Strengthen and Direct Development Towards Existing Communities
- ♦ Take Advantage of Compact Building Design

Ceiling Fans Installed at King Kaumualiʻi

In May, as part of KPAA's goal to provide support to public education, ceiling fans were installed in 17 classrooms at King Kaumualiʻi Elementary School. The school received a grant from Hawaii 3Rs and KPAA secured a grant from the Kapaʻa Rotary Club for the purchase of fans and completion of electrical work. Volunteers installed the fans on a scorching hot day that demonstrated just how much the fans were needed. Funds will be sought to complete the remaining 18 classrooms.
