

build relationships with our colleagues and the public.

Materials Flow, Materials Management and Climate Change

Have you ever wondered about all the stuff – food, fuel, cars, products of all kinds - shipped into and out of Kauai? How do these things impact our sustainability? A group of Yale University graduate students were on Kauai earlier this year and in July published their report <u>Material Flow</u> <u>Analysis for the Island of Kauai</u>. The report includes some interesting conclusions and recommendations for further analysis.

What should be done to respond to climate change is an issue communities and governments around the world are trying to determine. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) recently released the "U.S. EPA Materials Management & Climate Change Toolkit for Climate Inventories & Action Plans" to help them better integrate materials/products into climate inventories and action plans. This new toolkit provides resources to integrate material conservation into community-scale greenhouse gas (GHG) inventory and climate action planning. The <u>Materials Management and Climate Change Toolkit</u> includes:

• New approaches to greenhouse gas (GHG) inventories that quantify

emissions from materials

- Model Climate Action Plans that include materials conservation
- Innovative policies that can reduce material consumption and increase recycling and composting
- Example ordinances, standards, and policies to drive GHG reductions through materials management.
