The Board of Education and the Kauai District Complex Area Superintendent invite you to



Keiki to Career's New 3-Year Navigation Plan

Ten months of planning on the Keiki to Career initiative is distilled in this just-completed report that will be available May 15 at <u>www.keikitocareer.org</u>. Members from 25 agencies

and organizations worked to create the plan's strategies and actions designed to help young people from birth through age 24 be *Ready to Learn and Ready for Life.* Governor Abercrombie, Mayor Carvalho, Matt Lorin of The Learning Coalition and Darcie Yukimura of Hawaii Community Foundation joined in celebrating the plan's completion. The plan has been shared at three public meetings, two meetings of youth program providers, with faculty at most public schools and at sessions with a number of organizations. Work to implement the plan begins this month. KPAA serves as the "backbone" support, helping to coordinate
