After two years of planning, Keiki to Career Kaua`i is excited to enter a new phase of work with the implementation of its 3-Year Navigation Plan. In August,

Stacey Gillette started in her role as the new Keiki to Career Coordinator to support the work of more than 25 community partners committed to realizing the project's vision of "an island community where Kauai's keiki through young adults are healthy, confident, competent and caring." Partners across the island are now meeting monthly to coordinate their efforts in four focus areas: Birth to Grade 3; Parent, Ohana and Community Engagement; Resilience and Life Skills; and High School to Post-Secondary Opportunities. KPAA continues to serve as the backbone organization for the project. KPAA Contract Opportunity - Data Consultant Needed

An important part of Keiki to Career Kauai is establishing a way to evaluate and report the collective efforts across community partners to improve the lives of young people. We are currently searching for a contracted Data Consultant to assist the project with the development of a data management system. The Data Consultant will help select shared measures, create a way to track data across partners, encourage continuous improvement, and design a progress report to share results with the community. Kalalau Trail Restoration Work Continues

After ten months of hard work by Pono Pacific Land Management LLC and two 3-day volunteer weekend sessions, rehabilitation of this trail is 90% complete. KPAA has a contract with DLNR's State Parks Division to work on the most eroded and narrow portions of the trail from Hanakapiai to Kalalau in Napali Coast State Wilderness Park. Pono Pacific is utilizing environmentally-friendly



protocols to increase public safety yet retain the rustic aesthetics of this world-renowned trail. The trail has been brush cut, grubbed and widened to a tread of about 36 inches. In some areas the trail was re-routed back to its original alignment, closing off "social trails." Work should be complete by December. KPAA's Citizens Advisory Committee will be encouraging the Legislature to allocate additional funds to DLNR to maintain the trail and park facilities on an ongoing basis.
